These days not only Gothenburg High School students with outstanding athletic achievements are recognized.

Students with an ACT score of 30 or above have their name inscribed on a plaque next to the high school office on Main Street.

Landen Haake and Mark Hilderbrand are the latest honorees.

High school principal Randy Evans said the names of students who reach the academic accomplishment since the year the new school was built—2004—receive the honor.


"It's another way to recognize students and academics," he said. "So many times, we tend to look only at the athletic side."
