There may be more than a month left of summer but classes for Gothenburg Public School students will begin Tuesday, Aug. 17.

Students and parents will kick off the 2010-11 school year with an open house at the school from 5-8:30 p.m. Monday, Aug. 16.

Gothenburg junior and senior high school students will begin classes at 8:15 a.m. while elementary youngsters start class at 8 a.m.

Secondary students start later because of access time which allows students to meet with teachers for a half hour before school starts each day.

Access time was implemented last year to help students be successful in the classroom.

On the first day of school, all junior and senior high students will meet in the performing arts center for a general assembly.

Lunch that day will be served but there will be early dismissal at 1:30 p.m. for all students.

Once school is under way, the junior-senior high will dismiss at 3:30 p.m. each day.

Teachers returned to the classroom Tuesday and on Wednesday (today) and Thursday for data analysis.

An in-service is scheduled Friday and Monday. On Monday, teachers will be treated to an appreciation breakfast.

Kindergartners will start with half-day classes—from 8 a.m.-1:30 p.m.—until Tuesday, Sept. 7, when they begin full days.
