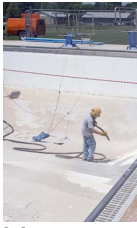


Pool receives facelift, June 6 opening date

Youngsters and adults looking forward to swimming in the city pool will have to wait a bit longer.

Usually, the Gothenburg city pool opens sometime over Memorial Day weekend.

However because of paint chipping off the pool basin, city officials decided the basin needed an upgrade.

Last Friday, the owner and a helper from Central Valley Sandblasting began sandblasting the floor and walls of the pool to remove about seven layers of rubberized coating.

On Wednesday or Thursday, they are expected to start application of an epoxy paint that is supposed to last four times longer than the coating that was removed.

Once the painting job is finished, the basin must cure for 10 days.

A Central Valley Sandblasting employee said it's important to re-coat the pool to prevent moisture from seeping into the concrete, which causes cracks.

City services director Shane Gruber said they plan to fill the pool on June 4 and allow the water to heat for a couple of days.

When the pool opens, hours will be 1-9 p.m. Lap swimming is scheduled every day from noon-1

Admission is \$2.

Sign up for swimming lessons is Thursday, May 23, and Friday, May 35, from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the pool.

The first sessions of swimming lessons are June 11-15 and 18-22.

Lessons for the second session are July 9-13 and 16-20.

The cost is \$15 per session.
