### Fire department puts donated funds to use

**COZAD**—The Lexington Volunteer Fire Department recently made a purchase with memorial fund dollars that were donated gifts over the past few years. A new Bobcat four-wheeler was purchased that will assist the department in accessing areas that would not be possible with a full size vehicle while fighting fires or performing rescues. The four-wheeler is equipped with a hose reel, a 70 gallon water tank and an area to place a backboard for injured victims.—reported in the Tri-City Trib.

### Rodeo Museum to feature local artifacts

**BROKEN BOW**—The Rodeo Museum in Berwyn, which is set for its grand opening this fall, has recently added a few pieces to its vast collection of rodeo history and memorabilia. Blaine Partridge, owner of the museum, received a saddle from Paul Tierney, one of Broken Bow's National Finals Rodeo (NFR) contestants since its inception in 1959. The museum will also feature a hat from Lin Hilton, who was the NFR announcer in 1972 and served as the county extension agent in Burwell in the 1960s. An entire ladies section is being planned as well as a front gate shoot to enter the museum. The plan is to include memorabilia for all the NFR qualifiers from Nebraska and the amateur rodeos.—reported in the Custer County Chief.
