4-H events the week before fair activities get underway

Four-H'ers across the county are working with animals and poultry, growing produce, sewing, putting together displays and more.

They'll show off their skills during the 4-H part of the fair which is Saturday, July 27 through Saturday, Aug. 3.

Three days later, on Wednesday, Aug. 7, the Dawson County Fair kicks off with a carnival, exhibits and entertainment.

Ann Johnson, event coordinator/office manager, said the fair was split this year because some 4-H'ers will participate in two-a-day sports practices when fair events begin on Aug. 7.

As a result, 4-H activities are the prior week with the exception of the 4-H dog show which is Thursday, Aug. 8.

The fair, with the theme "Fun for the Whole Herd," ends on Sunday, Aug. 11.

The Moore's Greater Shows carnival opens Wednesday, Aug. 7, and will remain open every evening through Saturday, Aug. 11.
