The rodeo will be at the roping grounds on 27th Street, north of Lafayette Park.

After the rodeo ends both nights, the evening will be capped off with a beer garden provided by the Rotary After Dark Club and deejay services from RTI Computer Sales & Service.

A concession stand will be manned by local Boy Scouts to help fund some of their projects.

The scouts will also run the concession stand at the rodeo from 4-10 p.m. on July 3 and provide breakfast, lunch and dinner on July 4 from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.

There will be pony rides and roping dummies provided for entertainment before 7 p.m. by Becky's Buckaroo's.

Proceeds will go towards the Dawson County Relay for Life that raises funds for cancer research.

In addition, the Gothenburg High School Rotary Interact Club will provide snow cones at the rodeo grounds as a fund raiser towards projects for the school year.
