

Farm and fun reunite at Dawson Co. Fair

After last year's separate schedules, the 4-H and carnival portions of the Dawson County Fair are rejoining forces this month.

The fun kicks off on Saturday, July 12, and doesn't end until Sunday, July 20.

The 4-H Cafe opens for the first time at 8 a.m. Saturday morning and stays open until early afternoon. Starting Wednesday, July 16, the restaurant will maintain regular hours of 8 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and close at 6 p.m. the last day of the fair.

The carnival's "Family Night" is Wednesday evening. After a full day of 4-H exhibits and contests, the carnival celebrates opening night with discounted arm bands and a bicycle giveaway. The carnival will begin each following night at 7 p.m. and will run until 10 or 10:30 p.m., depending on the day.

Bingo will be played from 6:30-9:30 p.m. from Wednesday to Saturday in the Extension office meeting room.

A NASCAR simulator machine will be available at the grandstand every day from 3-11 p.m., except on Sunday, when it opens at 5 p.m. The cost is \$3 per ride or \$5 for a timed ride that includes a cash prize.

Team penning begins at 7 p.m Thursday with free admission at the Dawson County Arena.

A public 4-H rocket shoot off is Friday and the James Lee Band opens for Bart Crow Band, starting at 7 p.m. in the grandstands. Admission is \$20.
