McCook threatened to take the lead in the top of the third with two outs and bases loaded but Melon left fielder Brady Preitauer put an end to it when he caught a deep fly ball by Justin Terry.

After holding the Melons to three-and-out in the bottom of the third, McCook scored in the fourth inning on a catcher's error but it was the only run the visitors would get.
