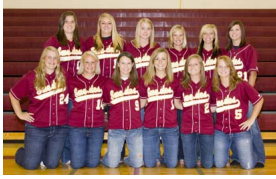


Third inning propels softball team to first win

Fortunately, that didn't happen for the Swedes in their season opening softball game last Thursday against Southern Valley at Stamford.

Gothenburg used a five-run third inning to break open the game en route to an 8-0 victory.

Anticipating an easier win, Swede coach Roger Neujahr told his team prior to the game that he would play the starters for two innings and then make wholesale changes, both on offense and defense. The same would occur two innings later.

However, Gothenburg scored just one run on three hits once through the batting order.

"We started slow," the coach said. "What caused that I'm not sure."

Then came the changes and a change in Swede luck. Three walks and a single quickly followed. The difference maker, though, was a two-run double by KaTrina Winter.

"You could just feel that the momentum shifted when she got the double and drove in the two runs," Neujahr said.
