KEARNEY—Inconsistent ball striking resulted in mounting frustration for the Gothenburg girls golf team in the opening meet of the season at Kearney on Thursday.

The Swedes finished eighth as a team at the Kearney Catholic Invite with a score of 481.

"The results of this first meet were fairly typical," said Swede coach Jim Henke.

"They were quite even in their scoring but recorded hardly any pars," Henke said.


Boson shot 56 on the front nine and 57 on the back to finish with 113 to lead the Swedes.
