“Jordyn pitched one of her best games ever,” Swede coach Roger Neujahr said. “She kept them off balance. Her change-up was really working.”

Cats get all the breaks

In a tight contest against evenly matched teams, being in the right place at the right time can make all the difference. That worked to Scottsbluff’s favor in a 4-0 win.

Everything that could have happened in the right spot positively for Scottsbluff did and the reverse was true for Gothenburg, Neujahr said.

“Every time they had a runner in scoring position, they got a key hit,” he said.

Scottsbluff used a leadoff single, a sacrifice bunt and a ground ball to take 1-0 lead in the first inning.

The Bearcats made another leadoff single pay off with a run in the fourth inning.

Gothenburg loaded the bases with no outs in the bottom of the fourth but came away empty.

“Jordyn hit a high hopper that the pitcher snagged and threw home then (the ball went) to first for a double play,” Neujahr said.
