

Swedes win grudge match over Indians

BROKEN BOW—With a win apiece between the Swedes and the Broken Bow Indians this season, last week's matchup of the Southwest Conference rivals was more than a four-team tournament game.

Gothenburg split games at the Broken Bow Invite on Oct. 19 falling to Doniphan-Trumbull 25-13, 25-21 before defeating the Indians in straight sets 25-15, 25-20.

"We came out against Doniphan-Trumbull with no energy," said coach Becky Costello. "It was like we were still on the bus."

The Swedes trailed the Cardinals throughout the first set.

"We were a step slow the whole time," Costello said.

Gothenburg fell behind in the second set as well, trailing 18-14 before coming back to tie at 20-20.

Jacey Wiggins and Taylor Mroczek had four kills each while Regan Geiken offered five blocks in the losing effort.
