LEXINGTON—Gothenburg golfers took a giant leap forward last week with a 37-stroke improvement in their team invite score.

The Swedes finished 10th at the Lexington Invite on April 12 with a four-player team score of 365.

Two and a half weeks ago when the season began at the North Platte Invite, Gothenburg carded 402 as a team.

"The weather didn't help us any. It was a horribly windy day but it was still a huge improvement," said Swede coach Don Graham. "I think we have a ways to go yet but if we can keep dropping the numbers from one week to the next that's a good sign we're moving in the right direction."


McCook won the team title at the Lakeside Country Club with a combined score of 310 including individual meet winner Sean Backer and three additional medalists.

VanAcker shot 43 on the front nine and improved two strokes to 41 on the back to finish with a score of 84.
