Ostergard was stranded at second and the Melons trailed 3-1.

Gothenburg kept Cozad from scoring in the second frame but couldn't manage another run until the fourth inning after the visitors padded their lead with four more runs.

Trey Kolbo walked and advanced to second on a wild pitch.

Kolbo ran to third when Ross Ostendorf reached first on a Cozad error.

Kolbo scooted home on another passed ball.

Cozad scored twice more in the top of the sixth inning on a single, a double and a walk as Adam Speck took over pitching duties for the Melons.

Trailing 9-2 going into the bottom of the seventh inning, Gothenburg put two more runs on the board.

Zach Wolf led off the inning with a walk and after Jett Seimer struck out, Speck followed up with another walk to put two Melons on base.

A single to right field by Gothenburg catcher Levi Walker and the ensuing error by Cozad's outfielder allowed Wolf to round third and speed home.
