### Softball team falls to GI reserves at Lexington

Sports seasons often include a series of highs and lows. It didn't take long for the Gothenburg softball team to come down from the high of beating Cozad Thursday night.

The Swedes lost in the opening round of the Lexington Invitational Saturday to the Grand Island JV squad. A pair of lackluster wins that followed didn't offer much consolation.

"We were flat," Swede coach Roger Neujahr said. "As a coaching staff we take responsibility for that. I'm not sure what it was."

Perhaps overconfidence after beating Cozad was a factor.

"Usually when you start feeling pretty good and start sticking your chest out, somebody is going to knock you down and we got knocked down," Neujahr said. "We will certainly try to avoid that situation again."

"The only fortunate thing is the NSAA doesn't count that game because it was a replacement game and it was a jayvee team," the coach said. "It doesn't count for anyone that played them in the tournament point-wise and record-wise."

"We're counting it as a loss and we should."

The uninspired play continued in wins over Chadron and Southern Valley.

The Grand Island JVs ended up winning the tournament. They beat Adams Central in the

GI reserves prevail 10-4

Grand Island used a pair of three-run innings to break a 4-4 tie after three frames.
