

Swedes place second after getting battered by Bulldogs

Gothenburg ran into a hitting machine for the Swedes' only loss at the Scottsbluff Invitational Friday and Saturday.

The victories came easily as Gothenburg gave up just one run in those four games.

"It's a very good tournament for us because we got to play five varsity and four jayvee games," Swede coach Roger Neujahr said. "We get plenty of action and that's good."

Three Swedes were named to the all-tournament team: Amanda Barkmeier, Becca Riley and Shay Wear.

Gothenburg hosts Holdrege Thursday and will compete in the Grand Island Northwest Invitational Saturday at Veterans Field.

Scottsbluff falls 8-0

Everything came together for an 8-0 Swede victory over the hosts in the tournament opener.

"It was a game that you strive for," Neujahr said. "We had great pitching, timely hitting and no errors."

Gothenburg scored at least one run in every inning but the second.

The Bearcats were retired in order except for a single in the second inning and another in the fifth. Neither advanced past first base.

The Swedes led 1-0 on Emily Franzen's RBI single.

Four more runs were added in a third inning that featured two sacrifice bunts and a sac fly. Shay Wear started it all off with a triple.

Errors and a sac fly by Franzen produced one run in the fourth and Olivia Lafleur singled in a run in the fifth.

Brittyn Munster started the sixth with a triple and then ended the game early when she scored on an error.

Becca Riley went 3-for-3, all singles.

Amanda Barkmeier fanned seven and didn't walk an opponent.

Cards fall to Swedes, 11-1

An eight-run third inning powered Gothenburg to an 11-1 victory over Chadron.

Holmes finished the game with a pair of hits, as did Brittyn Munster.

Gering hammers out 11-4 win

The Bulldogs's bite was too much for Gothenburg. Gering connected for 10 hits, including four doubles and a triple.

"They hit us extremely hard," Neujahr said. "That was the hardest our pitching has been hit in six or seven years."

Combine that with seven Gothenburg errors, and the Swedes faced a challenge they couldn't overcome.

The scouting report on Gering's pitcher, Jennifer Barge, showed that she liked to throw high pitches. That combined with a high strike zone turned into a two-hitter for Barge.

The Bulldogs scored a pair in the first inning and added a solo run in the third.

The lead grew to 8-0 when Barge helped her own cause with a bases-loaded double in the top of the fourth. Two more runs came home before that hit.

Gothenburg used three walks and Katlin Harm's RBI single for two runs in the bottom of the fourth.
