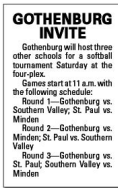


Vikings dominate Swedes in title game

Gothenburg has trouble with local native

The Gothenburg softball team ran out of gas in the championship game of the Grand Island Northwest Invitational.

The Swedes handled Central City 10-2 in the first round and clipped Adams Central 4-0 in the semifinals.

The tables were turned in the title tilt against undefeated Grand Island Northwest. The Vikings (16-0) dominated in all phases of the game while winning 11-0. They have eight shutouts this season.

The Swedes, now 15-4, face a busy week. Gothenburg traveled to Minden Tuesday for a triangular against the Whippets and Lexington. Next up are games against Alliance and Chadron Thursday at Ogallala.

The Swedes host Minden, Southern Valley and St. Paul in the Gothenburg Invite on Saturday (see box).

Despite all that hitting, the Swedes had just one hit and trailed 2-0 after two innings.

Katlin Harm led off the third with a single and scored on Brittyn Munster's single.

Things heated up in the fourth inning, starting with a leadoff triple by Hanna Wolf. Two doubles and a single followed that put Gothenburg on top 3-2.

The Swedes continued to pour it on in the fifth inning paced by Kyndal Holmes' triple. Gothenburg led 7-2.

Three more hits led to three more runs in the sixth inning.

In addition to the triples, players with doubles included Holmes, Becca Riley (2) and Harm.

Neujahr tried to get by starting Sam Tiedemann on the mound and resting starter Amanda Barkmeier, but the Swede freshman ran into some early trouble. Barkmeier came in and scattered three hits while fanning five batters.

The biggest blow in the game came when Holmes was injured in a collision at third base in the final inning.

The “book” on the Patriots’ pitcher was that she throws heat, perhaps the fastest the team will see this year.

Gothenburg managed only two hits—singles by Emily Franzen and Katlin Harm. The team had just two other base runners, one on an error and another from a walk.
