



Three shutouts propel Swedes to second consecutive state tournament

Gothenburg accomplished a season-long goal Friday, that was not unexpected, of earning a repeat berth in the state softball tournament.

The Swedes were expected to breeze through the competition which had a combined record of 52-121 going into District C-6 play. Three straight run-rule victories—Gothenburg outscored three opponents 31-0—earned the championship hardware.

The Swedes played well in all phases of the game despite the lack of competition. They combined for a .424 batting average (25-59) and committed just one error.

They got stellar pitching performances from Amanda Barkmeier who allowed just five hits overall while striking out 11 batters and walking none.



“We worked hard all week in spotting our fastball and our inside and outside pitches,” Swede coach Roger Neujahr said. “I thought she did an excellent job, probably the best we’ve seen (with her pitch location).”

Gothenburg, now 25-6, will open the state tournament at 3 p.m. Wednesday against Arlington.
