The Swedes caught fire early from behind the arc and the Indians had to play catch up the entire game.

The Gothenburg boys basketball team made four three-pointers and outscored Broken Bow 22-6 in the opening quarter of Friday's 60-54 victory over the Indians.

The Swedes made baskets from all over the court to start the game.

Borchardt scored the first two baskets on layins, Dawson Graham and Hahn made outside shots and Blake Ristine elevated on his mid-range jumpers to give Gothenburg a 16-point advantage after one period of play.

The Swedes cooled off slightly in the second quarter scoring only two baskets in the final four minutes of the half. Broken Bow, however, scored eight times and climbed back into the contest reducing Gothenburg's lead to 34-24 at the break.

In the third quarter, Gothenburg's defense regained control as its offense seemed unstoppable.

The Swedes didn't allow a basket for nearly four minutes after intermission and racked up 16 more points in the third stanza, extending their lead to 50-32.



With no other choice, the Indians stepped up its defensive intensity and started launching three-pointers. They forced turnovers and capitalized with a couple three-point baskets as time ticked away.

However, Broken Bow's efforts fell short as the Swedes held off the rally.

"We controlled the game from tip to finish," Koehler said. "We were up 18 going into the fourth and they made a little run with (Swede) subs in."
