

Kottwitz pins his way to first at SWC

Valentine dominates conference meet; Gothenburg wrestlers prepare for districts.

Gothenburg hosted the Southwest Conference wrestling meet and earned fifth place out of seven teams.

Valentine won the meet scoring 152.5 points with Cozad and Ogallala rounding out the top three.

The Swedes were represented on the podium by four wrestlers.

Skyler Kottwitz earned first place in the 170-pound weight class after pinning Kalen Hollopeter from Valentine in the final.

Jayden Miller was runner-up at 145 pounds with a pin of Nate O'Keif from Valentine.

Bryce Larson claimed a bronze medal at 106 with a 10-4 decision win over Clayton Glendy from Broken Bow.

Tyler Alvarez also was a medal winner with a third place finish after beating Hudson Pearman 7-4.

Head coach Tom Scott said the Swedes wrestled about as well as they could've and got to good points in their matches.

“That was a big meet for us with seeding for districts,” he said. “In district matches we went 4-2.”

With success in the conference meet, Scott and company have a confidence in themselves preparing for districts Friday and Saturday at Cozad, he said.

Teams competing in the B-4 district meet are: Alliance, Broken Bow, Chadron, Cozad, Gering, Gothenburg, Holdrege, Lexington, McCook, Ogallala, Scottsbluff and Sidney.



Matches on Friday start at 4 p.m. and the meet continues on Saturday with consolation rounds beginning at 9 a.m.

“We have some things to work on but our leadership is the best it’s been in three years,” Scott said. “Our wrestlers don’t have to (wrestle) outside themselves. They need to keep doing what they’re doing.”

Scott added that he tells his wrestlers to finish a couple spots better than their seed.

“They’ve done a great job of finishing higher than they started,” he said.

If the Swedes can get matches into the third period, Scott said he feels confident in the outcome.

“When we get into high end matches, up one or down one, we have a high percentage of
