After losing in the first round of the Southwest Conference tournament Jan. 28, the Swedes had plenty of time to rest before facing a .500 Badger team Friday.


"They were quicker than I thought they'd be after watching film." Lecher said.

In their effort of a come back, Lecher said the girls got tired at the start of the final frame. Gothenburg managed to score 14 points but gave up 17 more and lost by 13 as the clock ticked down to zero.
