Melons out hit Minden

Minden First Bank opened the scoring in the top of the second inning, scoring two runs off a single and an error.

Although the Melons recorded a hit in each of the first two innings, they would not score until the bottom of the third. By that time, Gothenburg had allowed three runs.

Chase Ostergard hit safely and scored off an error by the Minden third baseman. Ross Ostendorf, who reached on the error, made his way to third before an inning-ending strikeout.

Ostendorf pitched the first four innings, allowing one hit and three earned runs.

Hershland's five-run fifth inning was highlighted by a homer over the left-field fence by Landon Maassen. Ostergard was replaced by Brant May with two outs in the inning, having allowed eight runs—five earned—on five hits.

May got through the rest of the fifth and sixth without allowing any more damage.

The Melons failed to threaten the rest of the way, while Hershland added a run in the top of the seventh.

Matthies finished the day with three of the Melons' five hits. Riley Ostendorf added one hit and one RBI.

Nine runs not enough
