“There were a few times we really had to battle,” Johnson said, “but they got the job done. That’s what counts.”

The roller coaster continued its upswing with Brady’s first match at the Seven Valleys Tournament in Callaway on Saturday.

The Eagles defeated Mullen 18-25, 25-23 and 25-21.

“After we lost the first set, the girls really did a good job of staying focused and coming back to take the game,” Johnson said.

But the intensity didn’t stick around into the next round. Brady came out flat against Sargent and lost 25-8, 25-16.

“I really hate games like that,” Johnson said. “It doesn’t even feel like you’re playing. There was no intensity and I think maybe the girls were a little over confident.”

The frustration of losing to Sargent—a team Johnson said was certainly beatable—left the Eagles out of rhythm.

“It took us awhile to get back to where we felt like everyone was on the same page,” the coach said. “They weren’t fighting or picking at each other. I think they were all equally disappointed in the loss and probably a little shocked.”

Regardless of what caused the Eagle momentum to come to a screeching halt, Johnson said the girls turned it around enough to pull off a 26-24, 25-9 win over Sandhills/Theford in their final match.
