In the second period, Ward ran in from 5 yards out and also recovered an SMC fumble in the endzone to put Brady up 44-0 with 10 minutes to play in the first half.

Tyler Kleinow had a 7-yard scoring run and Dalton Riedel caught a 40-yard pass from Pohlman to complete Brady's first half scoring and give the Eagles what Frederickson called an unbelievable 58-0 halftime lead.
