

## Girls defeat Paxton, move to 2-0 on year

Brady's in-your-face defense allowed the Eagles to take a 6-0 lead over Paxton early Friday night and cruise to their second straight victory 51-38.

But while the score makes it look like an easy win, Brady coach Lance Arterburn said it was anything but a cake-walk.

The Paxton spurts didn't last long enough to hurt much, though, as the Eagles controlled the game.

"Our defense is what really keeps us going," Arterburn said.

Brady had 31 steals on the night, many of which the Eagles converted into easy buckets.

"We want to cause havoc all over the floor," Arterburn said. "And at times we did that well. We just have to control the turnovers on our end of the floor a little better."

The Eagles finished with 34 turnovers.
