“In the last 3:30 of the game, we only shot the ball twice,” Arterburn said. “I think the girls were a little afraid to make a mistake down the stretch.”

The shot percentage—42% overall—wasn't bad at all, the coach said. There just weren't enough attempts.

Too few shots and getting out-rebounded for the first time this season led to the Eagles' demise, Arterburn said.

“We knew they would be aggressive on the boards and they took it to us,” he said. “When you're not shooting much to begin with and then you give up a bunch of rebounds, your chances of winning keep going down.”
