

Eagles give Mustangs 24-point head start

The Brady football team has fallen into a bad habit that the coach hopes to break immediately if not sooner.

The Eagles spotted Sumner-Eddyville-Miller 24 points—18 in the first period—before finally getting on the board in the third quarter.

“Get rid of the first quarter and we win the ball game,” said coach Darren Tobey.

Unfortunately, he added, four quarters make a game.

The Eagles made a valiant comeback effort but lost 32-20 to move to 4-3 on the year.

“Defensively I thought we played well but all of that gets overshadowed when you lose,” Tobey said. “We held them to 200 yards total offense. I think that’s a pretty good number.”

The Eagles were getting shut down offensively, Tobey said, but it wasn’t by SEM.

“Who stopped us? We stopped ourselves,” he said.
