

Eagle boys make zone press work wonders against Broncos

Lacking much size, the Brady boys basketball team turned to speed and intensity to defeat the Wauneta-Palisade Broncos on the road Friday night 54-38.

The Eagles opened the season with a full-court zone press that kept the Broncos at bay through the first half.

“We started with the press and then backed into a 2-2-1 zone defense,” said Eagle coach David Jacobs. “It kept working so we stuck with it. I guess if it isn’t broke, don’t fix it, right?”

Brady cruised out to a 15-6 lead in the first quarter and pushed ahead to 33-13 at halftime.

“We are a quicker team this year,” Jacobs said. “We don’t have the kind of size we had last year so we have to compensate with our quickness.”

Brady’s speed had Jacobs a little concerned at times during the first half, though, as the Eagles committed 14 of the team’s 16 turnovers before the break.

“We did a better job of taking care of the ball in the second half and we also got a little better in our half-court offense,” the coach said. “That helter-skelter kind of scoring off the press isn’t always going to be there so we’ve got to learn to score in the half-court game.”

Senior Zach Mann led the Eagles in scoring with 20 points including a pair of three-pointers.

Freshman Nate Sitorius added 10 points for Brady while senior Bryley Roper pulled down 10 rebounds, offered four assists and grabbed four steals.

The Eagles (1-0) will host Paxton on Friday.

The Tigers were pre-season ranked at No. 2 in Class D-1 by the Omaha World-Herald and started this season with a pair of wins over Medicine Valley and Eustis-Farnam.
