On their third possession, Medicine Valley punted the ball, pinning Brady at the one yard line.

The Eagles hoped to get some breathing room but on an ensuing punt, the ball hit a Brady player and only went 12 yards, giving the Raiders excellent field position, Seamann said.

Brady gave up another touchdown leading to an unanswered 42 points.

“Our kids did a good job during practice executing the defensive gameplan,” Seamann said. “Friday, we did a terrible job executing that gameplan.”

Brady will look to bounce back against a good Wallace team.

Seamann said the team will have to get better at tackling and being aggressive this week.

“We have to play as a team on defense, all the time,” Seamann said.
