The Brady Eagles boy's basketball team is showing a blue-collar attitude in the first weeks of practice and head coach Dave Jacobs said he thinks the hard work will carry over into games.

"We are working very hard and the guys are determined to have another good season," Jacobs said.

With the loss of leading scorer Zach Mann, Jacobs said the team will play tough defense and use a balanced offensive attack to win games this season.

"Playing tough defense is what will keep us in games," Jacobs said. "Right now our biggest upside is the willingness to work hard on the defensive side of the floor."

Sandhills-Thedford will also contend due to their height and decent athletes, Jacobs added.
