"The thing is, if Callaway hadn't missed those free throws at the end, we wouldn't even have had an opportunity for a last-second shot," Britten said. "It's a really tough loss but hopefully we can learn from it and use it to build a little momentum."

After Friday night's 81-38 pummeling defeat at No. 2 state rated Hayes Center, the Eagles are 1-11 on the season with two rematches this week before entering the Sandhills Conference tournament at Arthur on Tuesday.
