LINCOLN—Feeding the world is the topic when four former U.S. secretaries of agriculture discuss “The Land-Grant Mission of 2012—Transforming Agriculture for the 2050 World” Friday, Sept. 28, at the Lied Center for Performing Arts, 12th and R.

The 7:30 p.m. event is the first Heuermann Lecture of the 2012-13 season. It features these former agricultural secretaries: Nebraska’s U.S. Sen. Mike Johanns, Nebraska native Clayton Yeutter, John Block and Dan Glickman.
